Entry Requirement of Program

1. M.Phil./MS in English/Linguistics/Applied Linguistics/ELT or equivalent (24 credit hours course work along with 6 credit hours for thesis) with minimum CGPA 3.00/4.00 or equivalent from an institution recognized by the Higher Education Commission.
2. The candidate must have cleared GAT Subject Test (minimum 60% cumulative score) or a GRE Subject Test (at least 50th percentile)/Admission test (at least 70% score) before the date of admission to the PhD Program.
3. Other requirements as stipulated by the Higher Education Commission.
4. Successful completion of the University's admission procedure.
5. Candidates who qualify the Admission Test will be required to submit Research Proposal as a pre-requisite to appear for an interview for final selection.

(Note: The University reserves the right to accept or reject applications for admission)
